The disappointment of Kamala's loss still lingers, but on January 8th at Passaic County Technical Institute (PCTI) here in Wayne, there still was much to celebrate for Democrats. Yes, Andy Kim retained New Jersey's Senate seat for the Dems, but on this night the rest of "Row A", winners in last year's election, would be sworn into office. Governor Phil Murphy was on hand to swear in the newly elected Passaic County Sheriff and Wayne resident, Thomas ("Tommy") Adamo. What's going on in Wayne? The Primaries!

This year's Primary Elections are still a few months away - Tuesday, June 10th to be exact. However, the Primary Election candidate filing deadline is right around the corner in March. Some may be aware that in order for candidates to be placed on the Primary Election ballot one must be petitioned for each election. Circulators go out to registered voters and have them sign the petition form for their candidate be placed on the primary ballot.

Already there are a handful of Democratic gubernatorial candidates who have declared their candidacy and are required to collect 1,000 signatures before March 24th. Also on the ballot will be candidates for two Passaic County Commissioner seats, Wayne mayor and three town council at large seats who will also require signatures to get on the ballot.

While all of this year's races are important, those right here in Wayne are especially critical. Township voters will be deciding who will be Wayne's mayor and who will hold the three council at large seats for the next four years. This comes at a time when the population of Wayne will be experiencing unprecedented growth as a result of the multiple housing developments that are being built to meet affordable housing targets.

There are differing opinions on how to meet those targets without causing such a dramatic increase in building. Unfortunately, Councilwoman Francine Ritter remains the lone Democrat on a nine-member Town Council, and the suggestions she has offered on behalf of the community have not seen the light of day. With a third round of affordable housing targets on the horizon, the future of our township has reached a crossroads, and we need our voices heard. We have screened six candidates thus far, but our door remains open for anyone else to step forward. Once the process is completed, our ticket will be presented to our Club members for endorsement.

This month we are proud to shine a spotlight on a truly remarkable Wayne Democratic Club member. Kamala Anupindi is a superstar who was just named Wayne's Person of the Year by Tapinto Wayne.

In 1989, a future Wayne resident named Kamala Anupindi emigrated from India with a one-way ticket to America, a college degree, and \$400 in her pocket, Thirty-five years later, with a master's degree and a PhD (ABD), this treasured member of the Wayne Democratic Club (and elected Wayne Democratic Committee member) has made such an impact in her chosen hometown that she has been named the 2024 Wayne Township Person of the Year.

Almost 25 years ago, Avik Ghosh and Kamala moved to Wayne and got married by the then Wayne Mayor in the Mayor's office. Years later, they adopted their beautiful daughter, Shivani, from India. Along the way, Kamala made a name for herself in the software industry and decided to give something back to the community where she had found such a wonderful life. And she hasn't stopped giving since.

Wayne's Person of the Year is well known in the Wayne community for her tireless efforts and commitment to service in support of others. Whether she is volunteering as a Court-Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for children; helping a neighbor in need through Wayne Volunteers (the community assistance organization she founded and leads); organizing and leading cultural events (like Wayne's annual community Diwali lighting); or supporting one of the many local service organizations dedicated to raising up those who need it most, Kamala seems to spend all of her free time and money giving back and, perhaps more importantly, inspiring those around her to get involved and do the same.

What Kamala has done has not gone unnoticed. She has been honored numerous times for her exemplary leadership in the Passaic County community, recognizing the transformation that can be achieved when people work together towards a cause. Kamala is steadfast in her dedication to ensuring that children living in foster care have everything they need for a safe, happy future in a permanent home (she personally mentors nine children over the past 5 years); as well as supporting homeless people; children and seniors in crisis; food banks; shelters; and so much more.

For over 20 years, Kamala has been organizing her friends and neighbors to lend a hand to support anyone in need. In addition to her almost full-time volunteering, she also personally finances many of her projects, mostly in the form of food, toys, clothing, and personal items. Since 2010, Kamala has used her knack for bringing people together toward a common mission and has grown the holiday wish program in her community to fulfill the wishes of more than 100 children in foster care every year.

Most notably, thanks to the networks she has created and with the help of social media, Kamala has established the "Wayne Volunteers" online community of local individuals who are equally eager to make a difference. Through Kamala's inspiration, this community has grown to more than 1,800 members across the county. Over the course of a year, this group supports Father English Food Pantry; Wayne Interfaith Network; St. Paul's Church; OASIS: A Haven for Women in Children; Eva's Village; and Summer Hill Senior Center, to name a few. In addition to these organizations, the Wayne Volunteers community has supported countless local families struggling to stay on their feet.
